To celebrate completion of the Historic England-funded revision of the Resource Assessment for the Palaeolithic period in the East Midlands, the East Midlands Historic Environment Research Framework¹ team is jointly organising this conference with the Council for British Archaeology East Midlands² group, with which it is closely linked.

This conference will consider how the last 15 years of research into the Palaeolithic period, since publication of *The Archaeology of the East Midlands* in 2006, have developed our understanding of the Palaeolithic in the region. We will place particular emphasis upon novel approaches to prospection, investigation and curation, and how these are being applied to Palaeolithic sites across the East Midlands. Dr David Knight and Prof. Nick Barton will chair proceedings.

Conference venue: The Monica Partridge Building is located adjacent to the Hallward Library in the centre of the campus (Building 62 on the map of the University Park campus).

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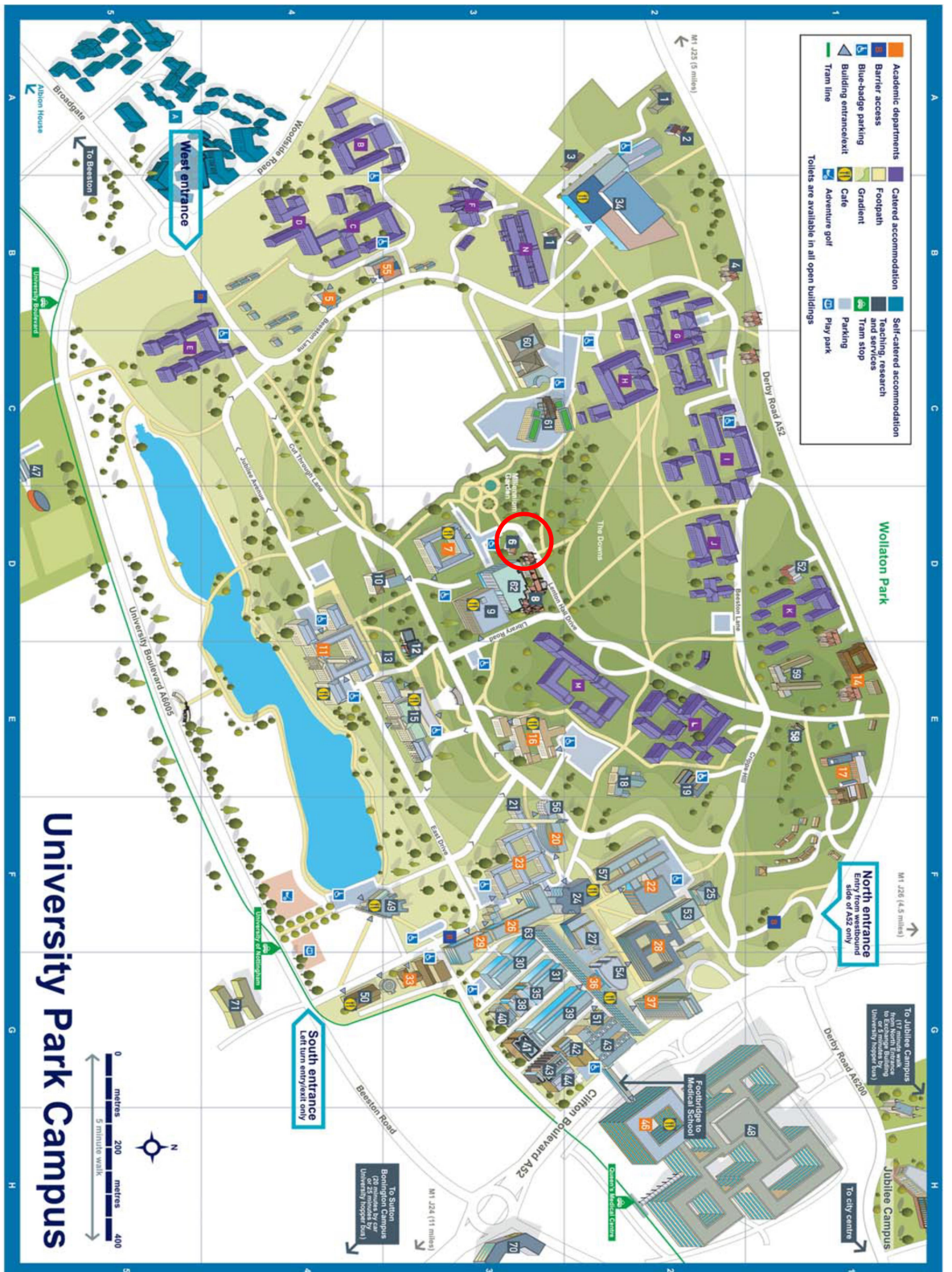
